The schedule and times are set, simply schedule a block of teams for your group to participate and be included in the total kart count for the race (up to 28 total teams can race per race).

Event Goal: Create a thrilling and competitive event for clients and their guests where people will be pushed outside their comfort zone, will have to rely on their level of team work to get to the front of the pack, and high fives will go well beyond trackside.

Using Karting for a unique and challenging team building adventure:

Ever dreamed of being a Formula 1 driver, racing the likes of Monte Carlo or Montreal? We give each participant the opportunity to be a race car driver without the need for a special license and in a format that every level driver, with or without experience, can be challenged. This is real wheel to wheel competition.

Endurance racing brings this experience full force. In an endurance kart race, teams are racing other teams. We start of the event with registration and gear assignment and then move onto the driver's meeting/safety review. Kart numbers will be assigned at a random draw. Teams will have an allotted practice time during which the fast lap time for the team will determine grid position. Then, with a traditional Le Mons start, the endurance race is started. Teams will have to rotate through their drivers during the race to complete the set minimum number of driver's changes (outlined on page 2). The most laps in the designated time wins.

The endurance format creates a synergy and bond between teammates as each member will be responsible for contributing to the driving, strategy, pits stop counts, and communications between the team and on-track driver. This is achieved by the minimum number of driver's changes teams must complete in the duration of the race. It is up to the team to create a driver rotation, time the segments so to complete the required drivers changes, make sure that each outbound driver has the required safety gear, and work on improving racing line and techniques with each stint as to improve lap times and overall position. Team strategy will be ever evolving throughout the race as the unexpected happens, such as off track penalties, double yellow flags for bunch ups, and more.



Adding to the competition is the fact that all the teams are lined up around the pit area, so teams are interfacing with other teams and competitors. Being a part of a bigger event with other teams participate will be to the advantage of the group as experienced races also competing that day are always happy to share tips and driving techniques. Watch to see who partners up and who says game on.



Any drivers that are not able to physically drive the karts can still be included with every other aspect of the team and the race. They ultimately become the team manager and usually are the busiest ones on the team.

Endurance Karting coordinates/supplies:

- Karts and all necessities to make them run
- Crew: Instructors, Pit Crew, Flaggers, Timing and Support Staff (only our crew touches the karts mechanically and for fueling).
